#### All of our classes have news items:

#### **Nursery News**

In the Nursery have been continuing our art work on the theme of circles. We explored lots of paint and glitter and the finished articles have made a beautiful display in the garden.



We are also working towards our ECO School reaccreditation at Oaklands. The Nursery children have been very busy setting up new recycling boxes and sorting out our rubbish into groups of either plastic or cardboard. Once we had done this we set off to the local recycling point ready to put our bottles and boxes in the correct containers.



Our pupils have also been putting a huge amount of effort into reaching their MOVE targets. This has involved using walkers and standing frames to help them participate in their learning and support them in getting about independently. We are so proud of their progress!



We have enjoyed using the brilliant Magic Carpet resource this year. The children are now very familiar with the activity and love interacting with all the different programmes using their hands and feet. The poppies, sunflowers and fish are all particular favourites!

#### Class 1

Class 1 have been working very hard on our MOVE and communication skills. Pupils spend lots of time standing, walking and sitting with more and more independence. We've also been participating in swim sessions twice a week and practicing our standing and walking skills at home.



Class 1's communication skills are progressing exceptionally well, too. Pupils are choosing from real objects, photos of objects, and some are even distinguishing between subtly different photos. Pupils are expanding their vocabularies and learning to tell us what they want in different ways. Other pupils are demonstrating strong awareness in their VI sessions, as well. Class 1 are very proud of the progress we have made this term. Well done everyone!

### St Crispins Class

The St Crispin's Class topic this term is 'Light and Dark' and we have started by looking at the changing seasons. We are making the most of the Millennium Woods and have been visiting them each week where we enjoy kicking through the leaves and spotting the fruits and berries which are still on the trees. We have been making fat and seed cakes as our Ecoschools project to help feed the birds through the winter. We hope to sell some of these at the front door of the school in the coming weeks. We are also learning about the festivals which take place during the dark months. We have enjoyed watching Diwali firework displays on our big screen and making pictures of them. Soon we will be moving onto Christmas. Our class will be performing The Nativity as part of the school show which we are all very excited about.



Recently we were lucky enough to be given a brand new popcorn maker for our class and we have been making good use of it; measuring out the corn and then watching and listening as it pops before eating it for our snack. Another gift was a Soda Stream machine and full bottle of gas which we will use in science and in cooking. We have also been given a huge bag of toys, another of books, a big bag of Mega Blox, a balance bike and a bubble machine. We can't thank the friends of our class enough for all of these fabulous donations!

#### Class 2

We cannot believe how quickly the time is passing as we head at break neck speed towards Christmas! Over this term we have created our Rainforest corner in the class with all the sensory topic work the children been doing. Class 2 have had our wonderful Music Students from Edinburgh University on a Monday. Each week the girls have come along with interactive songs they have created and performed for our children. They also performed at our assembly on the 28<sup>th</sup> of November.

Work is also beginning on our Christmas show. Our talented Art / Drama and Music Specialist are very involved with this project. Watch the home-school diaries and book your seats as soon as you get the chance. Class 2 plan to have an enterprise barter system for Christmas decorations made by the children. If you wish to have one of our salt dough stars or Christmas trees, send in an item for the Food Bank and we will send home one of our decorations!



It is planned that our barter stall will also make up part of the Enterprise stalls which will be on display at our Christmas show. So if you are coming to the Christmas show, please bring in your food bank food donation and take a decoration.

### Class 3

We have had three great visits to the Holyrood Challenge this term. All the activities were rainforest themed and we enjoyed tasting the tropical foods, meeting colourful animals and exploring the outside areas and the greenhouses. We've also had one visit to the Yard and are looking forward to another trip just before Christmas.

We're very happy to have welcomed Frances Duncan to our team. She is the class teacher on a Monday and a Tuesday.



In October we were learning about Harvest in RME and have learned a new harvest song. We also helped to harvest a range of vegetables and pulled a very large turnip as part of an interactive story. We had a great time at Halloween. We made witch and wizard hats, held a class party and took part in the school Halloween lunch.

### Class 4

We have been having a marvellous time recently learning about the rainforest animals and smells in class and at our Holyrood Challenge sessions. We have read stories in Drumbrae Library and in class about monkeys, parrots and snakes and have made soundscapes on the step-by-step to accompany some of them. In Music we have enjoyed gorilla big windy river songs.

Our enterprise recently has been making pakoras in Home Economics. We have mixed Besan (chickpea flour) with cold frozen peas; chopped smelly onions with special knives until they made us cry; chopped fresh-smelling bunches of coriander and then added spices from the rainforest with salt to give yummy flavour to our product.



We have had fun bagging and selling our produce around the school, having teased our potential customers with delicious aromas! Again, some of the class enjoyed using the step-by-step to advertise and encourage people around the school to dip into their pockets after lunch to support this enterprise. We take this opportunity to give you advance notice that we will be selling pakoras at our Christmas show on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> December. Come and buy. Come also to see our interpretation of Pocahontas too!



#### S1/S2

We have especially enjoyed cooking. We have decided to open 'The Oaklands Bakery' as one of our enterprise activities for this year. The pupils participate in cooking activities every week. We have been making a variety of products including soda bread, Spanish sponge cake and scones. We have been selling these products to raise funds for the Clown Doctors.

All the pupils in our class really enjoy the sessions we have with the Clown Doctors and this is our way of saying 'thank you' to them!



We also organized the 'Give it some welly' event for the Yard's 30<sup>th</sup> Birthday. It was a really good day with activities set up for the whole school to take part in. The pupils in S1/2 then went round all the classrooms collecting donations. At the end of the day and we raised £85.54! Thank you to everyone.

#### S3

The S3 boys have been very busy of late. They have worked together to raise over £60 for Gorgie City Farm (excluding costs of materials) by making and selling handmade fragranced soap, bath salts, biscuits and fudge. They have also expanded their range to include S'Mores pops (chocolate and digestive dipped giant marshmallows!), coconut ice and other sweet treats. They also go to the shops together to buy Enterprise ingredients and materials needed in class, and one boy used his walker around the shops for the very first time. They are acquiring skills whilst focusing on the Health and Wellbeing, Social Studies and Science areas of the Curriculum.



The S3 boys have also been to the Yard, taking part in various activities. One boy used his MOVE skills to navigate the whole of the Yard in his walker, and two boys went on the chute for the very first time! The same two boys also rode the see-saw together, whilst another made lovely music on the piano. Another pupil has been attending weekly Home Economics classes at Craigroyston High School, where he has helped to stir and cook ingredients to make treats to take home. Another pupil has attended regular swimming galas, earning a silver medal. All of the boys who have swum, have enjoyed successful swimming sessions.

#### <u>Seniors</u>

This is another busy term for the senior class as we continue to get ready for our upcoming Christmas Roadshows. This year, the seniors will be visiting a variety of locations across the city, showcasing and selling lots of the brilliant enterprise products made by Oaklands pupils. We have a whole range of goodies on offer from Sweetie Jars to Reindeer Poo! We have been getting crafty by making fingerprint Christmas posters to help advertise our products; it was very messy but good fun! A selection of Oaklands enterprise goods will be available for

parents/carers to buy in the run up to Christmas; more information to follow soon so keep a look out in your child's school bag.



Alongside out Christmas Roadshow preparations, the seniors are continuing to work towards a range of ASDAN and National Qualifications. We are exploring textures, tastes and smells through cooking activities such as making jams, pizzas and cookies. A recent trip to the barbers as part of the Personal Care award went down a treat! The pupils enjoyed trying out the hairdryers and sampling some fancy hair wax. We look forward to many more opportunities to be out and about in the community on work experience, at college and visiting the shops.

### SQA -Star Award for Senior Pupil

On Friday the 11<sup>th</sup> of November staff from Oaklands School attended the SQA Star Awards at The Assembly rooms on behalf of former pupil Gregor Downie.

Gregor had been nominated in the School Candidate of the Year Category for his exceptional work in the Senior Phase at Oaklands School. Gregor obtained 19 National Qualification units and awards in a wide range of subjects in levels 1, 2 and 3.



### **Expressive Arts**

From papier mache bugs, to copper creations, the pupils have again produced wonderful art work this term. In response to visiting an exhibition by Karla Black in the Modern 1 Gallery, S1 had fun producing interesting pieces using similar materials back in class. The seniors enjoyed using hammers while making copper models connected to their Asdan work and the primary department immersed themselves in many activities related to the rainforest.

The secondary department had fun and frolics during a special visit from the local fire service. Pupils also visited the local police station and other local areas to complement their community drama story.



We're hoping that families will be pleased with the printed results of the enterprise Christmas cards. The school will also be entering the council Christmas card competition and enjoying many other Christmas activities within art and drama. It's a busy and exciting time ahead.

## News from the Sports Coach

We are in our second term of swimming lessons and I am astonished by what our pupils have achieved in such a short period.

The nursery, primary and class 1 St Crispins have had great fun. Through constructive games and songs we are working on developing their water confidence and unlocking their potential to swim as independently as they can; either with or without swimming aids.

They have also been sharing these new found skills with their parents during our parent and child swim sessions.

We are using the 'Amateur Swimming Association - learn to swim' programme and over the coming months, pupils will be gaining certificates as they develop their swimming skills.



Our secondary pupils are all achieving great things too! They are working on their core swimming skills; such as safe entry and exit; buoyancy and balance; aquatic breathing; streamlining, rotation and orientation.

Several of our swimmers are gaining distance certificates and badges. So far our biggest distance swimmer has swum 200m (8 lengths)! We were delighted at being given the opportunity to participate in two Lothian Disability Sports Swimming galas. Team Oaklands swam well and all participants were very proud of their medals.



#### Give it some Welly!

The Yard is a purpose built indoor and outdoor adventure playground for children and young people with disabilities.



The Yard is celebrating 30 years this November!

Oaklands School joined in and celebrated this special event. 'Give it Some Welly for the Yard' was a success in our school. Working bent hand with extended thumb (palm up/out) brushes chin down towards waist, fingers touching thumb.

### <u>Star</u>



"N" hands and thumbs (palms forward, pointing up) at head height. Fingers and thumb open and close alternately while making small upward movements several times
